THE FIELD TRIP SUMMER CAMP EXPERIENCE

Our premier day camp program allows campers to experience the natural splendor of Georgia on daily field trip adventures. Most days include lake swimming at Georgia's best freshwater beaches with our Wilderness Lifeguards. Weekly educational themes foster a fun hands-on learning environment that deepens knowledge, inspires new interests, develops skills, and cultivates friendships.

AGES 5-11 FIELD TRIP DAY CAMP OUTDOOR ADVENTURE

TREES

June 1-5 July 6-10 July 27-31 Climb, jump, swing, and zip through the trees at the aerial adventure park Treetop Quest. Learn fascinating facts about forest watersheds in a program at the Chattahoochee River National Recreation Area. Hike through Clinton Nature Preserve and Big Trees Forest Preserve, an urban forest education center. At Callaway Gardens, follow a nature trail representing several Georgia tree and plant habitats, including a piedmont and southern Appalachian forest, coastal plain, bog, and wildflower meadow, and visit Aqua Island for a water adventure.

June 15-19 June 29-July 2 (*4 days)

From mountaintops to underground, explore Georgia's rocks. In the first session for ages 6 and up. experience the thrill of caving at Raccoon Mountain Caverns, one of the most geologically active caverns in the South. Search for rose quartz, aquamarine, tourmaline, and more at the Hogg Mine on an authentic dig. Hike the granite monadnock Arabia Mountain, an ecological wonder. Go 200 feet underground to visit the largest hard rock gold mine east of the Mississippi and get a glimpse of life 100+ vears ago during Georgia's turn-of-the-century gold rush by panning for treasures. Spend a relaxing day at the lake with beach games and rock-themed activities. **Hiking**

June 8-12 July 13-17

Canoe the flowing Class I rapids of the Chestatee River with a stop along Big Bend Beach. Get in the streams of Charlie Elliott Wildlife Center to examine water quality and discover macroinvertebrates such as salamanders, crayfish, and dragonfly nymphs. Visit Newman Wetlands Center to understand how wetlands improve water resources and support wildlife. Spend a relaxing day at the lake with beach games and river-themed activities. Tour the wonders of Callaway Gardens, including an adventure at Aqua

WILDLIFE

June 22-26

July 20-24 Get up close with Georgia wildlife at the North Georgia Zoo and Dauset Trails Nature Preserve, a wildlife rehabilitation center home to several species of native mammals and birds of prey. Meet animal species from around the world, including the world's tallest mammal, on a feeding tour at the Wild Animal Safari, which is ranked a Discovery Channel top 10 destination to see wildlife in North America. At Callaway Gardens, tour one of the largest glassenclosed tropical butterfly conservatories, learn about birds of prey, and visit Aqua Island for a water

FIELD TRIP DAY CAMP BASICS

- **Drop-off times:** 8:15 a.m. to 8:45 a.m.
- Pickup times: 5:45 p.m. to 6 p.m. (After 6 p.m. on Fridays, including pizza)
- Cost: \$495 per week for standard field trip sessions (\$400 week of June 29); \$520 for XL adventure
- Discount: \$30 off 2nd and more sessions in the same registration
- **Staff:** We maintain an adult ratio of 1:7 highly trained staff, lower on river days

FIELD TRIP FAQ

Can campers be placed together on the bus?

XL sessions have one bus so all campers registering the same week will be together. There are two buses for standard sessions that will be divided according to age. Please include your buddy request, including siblings, during registration. For campers with an age gap, please indicate if you prefer the younger or older bus. Will you make exceptions to the age requirement for camp? No one younger than age 5 is permitted to enroll. Many destinations have a strict minimum age, and others may vary based on experience. Inquire for specific details. What if my child is not a strong swimmer? PFDs are worn canoeing, kayaking, and rafting. Before lake swimming, Wilderness Lifeguards conduct swim checks with all campers to determine level of ability. Many campers prefer to stay on the sandy beach or in shallow areas regardless of ability, and swimmers are not permitted to enter deeper water without skills verification and swim band identification. Are parents able to join an activity of camp? Yes! Check out the Parent Field Guide for details.

AGES 9-12 XL FIELD TRIP DAY CAMP

RIVERS XL ADVENTURE

June 1-5 June 22-26

Raft Class III-IV rapids through the rocky shoals of the Chattahoochee River at the world's longest urban whitewater rafting destination,

Whitewater Express. Kayak the rapids of the Chestatee River, and tube down the

Chattahoochee River from its headwaters in the Appalachian foothills through the Alpine village of Helen. Hike to the twin waterfalls of Anna Ruby Falls which plunge more than 150 feet, trek overlook of the north Georgia Blue Ridge to the beautiful Raven Cliff Falls swimming hole in the Chattahoochee-Oconee National Forest, and admire Atlanta's own intown natural beauty

NEXT-LEVEL THRILLS

Experience the thrill of caving on a wild cave expedition at Raccoon Mountain Caverns, one of the most geologically active caverns in the South. Descend a trail down the 1.000 foot Tallulah Gorge, a canyon featuring several waterfalls, a suspension bridge, and the sliding rock, Bridal Veil Falls. Hike up the Indian Seats Trail at Sawnee Mountain Preserve for a breathtaking mountains. Kayak the Class I rapids of the Chestatee River with a stop at the secluded Big Bend Beach for swimming and a picnic lunch. Spend a relaxing day at the lake with beach games and rock-themed activities.

ON SITE DAY CAMP AGES 5-9 **NATURE FUN**

Our certified wildlife habitat features gardens, a chicken coop, and playground. Weekly day camp fun includes nature art, crafts, or woodworking; wildlife studies with animal interactions; plant explorations with gardening; hands-on environmental science; and active movement, including nature voga or games. Most days include water activities, such as our river-themed water slide.

TREES XL ADVENTURE

June 15-19 July 13-17 July 27-31 Enjoy a birds-eye view of the north Georgia mountains on an experiential canopy tour at Unicoi Aerial Adventure Park, featuring 11 ziplines, 7 skywalk towers, and 2 bridges. Climb 70-foot ropes into a 60-year-old willow tree at Blackburn Park with Tree Climbers International. Enjoy the shaded banks of the Chestatee River while kayaking down the Class I rapids and the wooded cover of the disc golf course at Suwanee Creek Park, a trailhead to hardwood forests and wetlands. Spend a relaxing day at the lake with beach games and treethemed activities.
